SSC GD Syllabus and Exam Pattern 2025

The candidates who are going to appear for the exam must have planned to start their preparation for the SSC GD 2025 exam with the latest SSC GD Exam Pattern and Syllabus. The SSC GD written exam will be held for 160 marks, which will consist of a total of 80 questions and each section will have 20 questions. The latest SSC GD Constable syllabus is discussed below. To qualify and be shortlisted for the vacancies, candidates must go through each stage of the selection process as detailed below.

- 1. Written examination (Computer Based): The CBT exam consists of 80 Multiple Choice Questions with 2 marks each and a negative marking of 0.25 marks. The duration to complete the exam is 60 minutes (1 hour) with no sectional timing.
- 2. Physical Efficiency Test (PET) and Physical Standard Test (PST).
- 3. **Medical Test-** The last stage of the selection process which is mandatory to check whether the selected candidates are medically fit or not. After the medical test, the candidates shortlisted will have to appear for document verification.

SSC GD Exam Pattern 2025

SSC GD Constable Tier 1 exam will be conducted **online mode, multiple-choice-based exam**. The CBT test consists of 4 sections with 80 questions in total for a time duration of 60 minutes. There is also a **negative marking of 0.25 marks** for every incorrect answer. The Computer-Based Examination (CBE) is conducted in English, Hindi and 13 Regional Languages viz. Assamese, Bengali,

Gujarati, Kannada, Konkani, Malayalam, Manipuri, Marathi, Odia, Punjabi, Tamil, Telugu and Urdu.
